I would ask you to have the MCA attorneys weigh-in on the situation, as it is clear that you do not plan to follow policy and allow the Board of MCA discuss the issue in the proper venue.

First issue - Why is this complaint being dismissed by the person being accused and not brought before the MCA Board for discussion?

Second Issue - Why did you not disclose that your husband had not completed a Level II screening and volunteer paperwork. Why was he allowed to volunteer at the school when "ALL" parents are required to have the volunteer paperwork and screening completed, not just parents that "work with students" as you claim. The MCA website and Mason Classical Academy Handbook do not distinguish between working with students and volunteering as you have stated. If there is any question that policy may or may not have been violated, then it is the duty of the Board to address that question in full in an open meeting, not for you to summarily dismiss as unfounded.
